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# Course Brochure

## AIPSA Programme in Insolvency Law and Practice

**22 February – 28 November 2011**

The course is practice-orientated and is aimed at persons involved in the administration of insolvent estates. The notes, which are updated annually, have been written by experts in practice and concentrate on the practical aspects of the administration of insolvent estates.

### CONTENT

Inter alia the course deals with:

- the effects of insolvency upon the insolvent, the solvent spouse and unexecuted contracts;
- impeachable transactions;
- the appointment, powers and duties of trustees and liquidators;
- insolvency meetings, interrogations and the proof of claims;
- rehabilitation;
- secured, statutory-preferent and concurrent creditors;
- the drafting of liquidation and distribution accounts;
- compromises and compositions;
- liquidation of companies and close corporations and judicial;
- management;
- partnerships; and
- cross-border insolvencies

### COMMENCEMENT OF LECTURES AND MODE OF INSTRUCTION

This is a one year course, which starts on 22 February 2011 and concludes with two written examinations on 25 and 28 November 2011 respectively. Registration will be open until 31 May 2011. Recorded lectures on DVD will be provided to delegates who have registered for the correspondence course.

The course material will only be sent to individuals on receipt of proof of payment for the full fees. The class attendance course will have lectures, normally held on Tuesday evenings between 18:00 and 20:00. There are ten two-hour lectures per semester. (The option of class attendance is, however, subject to the number of registrations for this option.)

### COURSE FEES (CE at UP IS EXEMPT FROM VAT)

The course fees are as follows:  
Correspondence course: R6 000.00  
Class attendance course with lectures: R6 300.00  
All fees include the prescribed notes (in English) and course DVDs.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All persons involved in the administration of insolvent estates may enrol. A relevant tertiary qualification or a matric certificate with relevant practical experience is a requirement for enrolment.

### LANGUAGE

Lectures are presented in English only.

Course material (study guides, notes and DVDs) is only available in English. Examinations and assignments may, however, be answered in **English or Afrikaans**.

### EVALUATION

Delegates are prepared for the examinations by the completion of two optional assignments and a workshop. The presentation of workshops is reliant on the number of registrations in the various centres, and when presented are done so approximately two months prior the examination.
